7:25 PM – [Discussion] WCMS Dues for Wayne Health Docs (10 minutes)

- WCMS = Wayne County Medical Society, a local Alliance organization of the the Michigan State Medical Society and the AMA
- Dr. Davluey came to the WSU AMA chapter to bring to our attention regarding Dean Schweitzer's 2021 decision that the Wayne Health Physician Group no longer will have automatic member dues paid for WCMS as part of their hiring contracts to become members
- The Dean decided to remove this from contracts and left it up to the department chairs to decide
 whether to incorporate these dues in their departmental hiring contracts
 - o We are still investigating with Dr. Davluey as to how and why this decision came about
- From the student perspective, Wayne presence in this society is extremely important due to the amount
 of resolutions that are submitted to the MSMS and eventually the AMA. We frequently bring the largest
 number of resolutions to the table each year with the goal of enacting positive change in the healthcare
 world
 - Important to note, students cannot submit a resolution unless doctors that are members sign off on the resolution, noting their support for the initiative. So if fewer faculty are members, students will likely have to work harder to find support for their initiatives
- If any students are interested in helping with this fight, we are interested in putting together a presentation about this to appeal to Dean Schweitzer, and any other relevant stakeholders
- As the curriculum is trying to move toward community involvement, we feel that this move directly goes
 against this, and the school's mission as a whole

- The Internal Student Analysis is required by the LCME to be done at some point as part of their accreditation requirement
- Not required every year by the LCME, but required to be done at some point leading up to their site visits, our next one is in 2023
- Decided not to do the ISA for 2020, due to the irregular nature and the fact that the pandemic learning is not necessarily a reflection of our "normal curriculum" delivery
- Basically, it is a survey delivered to the student body, and the data is independently handled by students to ensure that it is representative of the student perspective
- Dr. Booza recently came to explain to Cullen and I(Jenna) why it is important and asked us to drum up support and get the word out to the student body for them to do the survey this year, he also wants to come and explain how it works to the whole senate soon
- Part of the ISA involves coming up with actionable items that the school can take to address the areas
 of weakness identified in the survey
- It is up to us as Senate to create a student subcommittee to drive this. It will be composed of internal
 and external senate members, we would definitely like to have some representation from the CMC
 external committee on this
- **Timeline:** Student Committee Should be Created now -> Survey goes out to the student body in Jan/Feb 2022 -> analysis needs to be done by springish
- ? are there already questions to use as a template from previous surveys?
 - We do not have flexibility in the questions asked because they are standardized by the LCME so they can be compared across all US medical schools
 - We do have influence on how administration uses the information and addresses it
 - o It has to be analyzed independently by students per LCME guidelines
 - Dr. Booza said that at other institutions and here, it has historically been really important to have representation from all 4 classes in this project
- ? Is this related to the "you said we did" newsletter that was sent out last week related to curriculum changes?
 - No, this was a result of the organizational communication study and other student grievances over the years
- Dr. Booza was thinking about having this as part of the MedEd elective but so far that hasn't happened yet, hopefully we will get an update on that soon
- Motion to form the ISA committee APPROVED
 - We will have a senator volunteer(s) to lead it who will send out an interest form soon, be on the lookout!

- Dean Schweitzer's updates from the Medical Alumni Association Meeting
 - New 3-year MD program, scheduled to be piloted with this year's incoming class of 2026
 - Will be open to about ~3% of the class, ~10 people
 - Applicants will be strong students with lots of past experience in healthcare, mature, diversity also goal
 - All Wayne residencies have agreed to participate in this, it is similar to like a Med-direct, so Wayne med student -> Wayne residency

- Still working out the logistics of the application review process as well as advertising, likely will involve residency program directors
 - Student comment Seems like a lofty goal to get the goldy-locks candidate, would be good to have student input on this
- Can revert to the 4 year track at any point if their career direction changes, or there are academic concerns
