- Representative from the organization As an exec board, we discussed the recommendations
 with the BSO about the points that you all wanted to discuss further. As a brief overview of the
 organization our goal is to bring knowledge about investing, business, and wealth
 management to students in the SOM.
 - Regarding non-licensed financial advice our exec board will not directly be giving the
 advice as students, we are going to be bringing in licensed speakers knowledgeable
 about the topic as well as post informative knowledge on their instagram with sources
 - Regarding Board Transition Process decided to create an application for people applying for positions. The application will be reviewed by exec board members prior to inviting for an interview
 - Finances of the Organization initially we requested \$1,000 as a seed fund for a real-life trade example that people could see move through the market. We are no longer going to do this. We will be using a paper trading account instead this uses fake money in which the transactions can be tracked exactly as real money can. We are a little concerned about less interest by our membership because of the lack of real money at stake, but it is the best we can do
 - Need for a faculty member from the SOM advising the org already had Dr. Deborah
 Jones as an advisor from the business school, but now have Dr. Jefferey Potts as the
 new SOM advisor. He has experience in counseling dermatology residents on finances
 and has experiences in both cash and insurance based medical billing/income tracking
 - Diversity an issue of concern was ensuring equity that everyone feels welcome in our organization, especially in exec board representation. When we are trying to bring people on board as an exec member, we are going to aim for as diverse of a board as possible and we have also added a justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion (JEDI) chair to the board (BSO JEDI chair helped them create this position)

7:05 – [Discussion] Listserv access (10 minutes)

- Some senators are working on drafting a document outlining the importance of access to the student listserv to bring to the administration as part of the ongoing dialogue surrounding
 - We are working to draft solutions to preserve accessibility and reduce grievances
 - This is a university wide decision to filter the emails to the student lists
 - The email filter is an upper level communications administrator. She is also collecting data to better inform this process moving forward. Details on the filtering timeline to guarantee your advertisements go out in time can be found in recent BSO newsletters
 - Very few departments actually know this filtering is happening, so the word is slowly getting out
 - It is likely listservs will be restricted so that individual students won't have access, probably not much we can do about it, but we can advocate for alternatives
 - We have been trying to promote the use of GetInvolved, but with limited success
 - Hoping to have every student org given an email to use to distribute information as they need to
 - Students will likely be required to have email professionalism training
 - BSO is hoping to have a "new board member orientation" in November after boards transition

- Our hope is to have the report finished within the next week to present to leadership
- Board events and clinic hours engagement data has been being collected and sent.
 Orgs need to be more proactive and aren't used to this culture shift
- A note on spam the spam emails typically come through the administrative distribution lists, not the student ones
 - The IT people have been working on it, it seems like currently the two factor authentication system to try to hammer down on security is an opt-in system currently, but maybe that will change in the future

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Executive Senate Reports

7:15 PM – **[Update]** Internal Student Analysis (ISA) 2022 Committee (10 minutes)

- ISA is part of the LCME accreditation process
- Regarding the LCME Accreditation process:
 - An institutional self-study, which is a data-based self-analysis by the medical school of its performance in the 93 accreditation elements.
 - Includes a survey of students in all classes (the independent student analysis) that is conducted and analyzed by students.
 - A survey visit, which is an evaluation by a survey team composed of external peer experts that results in a report of the survey team's findings for each accreditation element.
 - The LCME's review of the survey team's report.
 - The LCME's determination of the program's performance in accreditation elements, its compliance with the 12 accreditation standards, its accreditation status, and any necessary follow-up to address identified problem areas.
- Accreditation Standards:
 - Mission, planning, organization, and integrity
 - Leadership and administration
 - Academic and learning environments
 - o Faculty preparation, productivity, participation, and policies
 - Educational resources and infrastructure
 - o Competencies, curricular objectives, and curricular design
 - Curricular content
 - Curricular management, evaluation, and enhancement
 - Teaching, supervision, assessment, and student and patient safety
 - Medical student selection, assignment, and progress
 - Medical student academic support, career advising, and educational records
 - Medical student health services, personal counseling, and financial aid services
- The independent student analysis:
 - Student portion of the LCME accreditation process
 - Mainly serves to assess, commend, and critique medical education at WSUSOM
 - Allows the students and faculty the privilege of anonymously review the institution's strengths, as well as facilitating discussion of the school's weaknesses and catalyzing changes where reform is needed
- The proposed timeline for the ISA is as follows:
 - o Oct. Nov. 15th Assemble committee

- ~ 2 per class
- Nov. Dec. 15th Draft ISA
- Add on to existing questions given by LCME
- Draft specific versions per class
- o Dec. Jan 15th Finalize ISA and develop distribution plan and communications
- o Feb. 15th March 30th Distribute survey and incentivize students to complete
- o April Analyze survey data
- May Draft narrative report and initial solutions
- June Finalize report
- o April 2023: site visit by LCME
- Will meet ~ once per week or once every two weeks until the report is finalized
- Proposed Subcommittees:
 - Distribution and Communication
 - Send out surveys and communicate with the student body about the importance of ISA
 - Question Creators
 - Decide which questions to include in the survey
 - Create new relevant questions to each class
 - Will likely break the survey up by pre-clinical vs clinical
 - Data analysis
 - Analyze the results of the surveys
 - Format the data received
 - Narrative
 - Write the final report with data from analysis and possible solutions
 - General format provided by LCME but creative additions encouraged to fit institutional needs
- We need 70-80% participation from all 4 classes. Currently discussing incentivisation to fill out the survey with money options
 - Could do LCs within classes as small subgroups to pit against each other
- Look out for an email from senate leadership about getting involved in the committee, likely weekly meetings to start with

- Get on this with Alumni Association as potential funds to subsidize as soon as possible and see

 - Ticket prices sound very steep for students to consider, pitch this to alumni as an incentive to help out
 - People are probably going to be visiting their families as well so ticket sales might be down
- o Is open bar necessary? Would it decrease the total cost to have a cash bar?
 - We'll check!
 - Unfortunately the drinking vs. non drinking tickets won't work out due to Roostertails contract stipulations
- For future years, thinking about how we can fundraise to bring ticket cost down significantly in advance
- Are we requiring vaccinations for students and guests?
 - Probably
- Will be doing a graduated ticket price scaling, get tickets early = lower price
