- Standardized Question: In our current social setting, what is a way that we as future physicians can specifically use technology to positively impact our generation?

6:55 PM – [Presentation] Religious Holiday Survey Data (20 min)

- IJI members looking at the policies, and did a survey of attitues and beliefs regarding this
 policy and how it affects religious minorities and their holidays
- Needed raw data to prove that it affects minority religionis more than others
- Current policy has a number of recognized holidays, only recognized one that we have break on is Christmas
- If your holiday isnt christmas, you have to request specific extra time off
 - Will only be approved "If the request is considered appropriate."
 - Weird because the title mentions holidays, but says "non-medical reasons are not granted."
 - o Too subjective, up to counselor
 - Students requesting time off would usually have to do additional makeup work that is outside of the curricular status quo
- Survey details (171 responses of completion, 330 total)
 - o Demographics: Year, gender identity, racial identity, religious/spiritual identity
 - Experiences with current policy: Awareness of current policy, difficulties with current policy, any extra measures that were taken to get a holiday off
 - Most not aware of current policy, most students that were muslim had difficulties with time off (p < 0.01)
 - Only 9% of students got straight up denied an absence per this survey, and most were muslim
 - Extra work: again, despite the fact that muslim students were not the majority of students answering, they seemed to have the most experience with having to do extra work to makeup their missed time
 - Likert scale style questions that assess attitudes towards current policy
 - 29% of students somewhat/strongly agreed that the current policy caused distress
 - 60% somewhat/strongly agree that the current policy needs to be revised
 - 47% somewhat/strongly disagree that the current policy is fair towards minority religions
 - 73% somewhat/strongly agree that a new policy would create a more inclusive encironment
 - 71% of students somewhat/strongly agree that the new policy should NOT use wellness days

- 80% of students somewhat/strongly agreed that it is important to them that institutions support their religious beliefs by allowing them time off for their holidays
- Maybe potentially pose a question about this in the upcoming ISA meeting?
- Submit your holidays in advance, and work with clerkship directors to get that time off
- Need to make a distinction between wellness/spirituality and organized religious holildays
- Class data was pretty even, 3rd year may have had the most respondents tho (not on presentation)
