- Constitution committee manages the constitution which is a list of our rules and regulations, and is currently updated on the senate website
- We run by the bylaws (article 9), procedures or order and business
- Attendance and Quorum
 - Attendance is taken by the secretary
 - Quorum = $\frac{2}{3}$ of voting members of senate
 - Meeting minutes are distributed by email after the meeting
 - Up to senators to cross check the minutes and make corrections
- Order of business
 - Guest speakers → old business → new business → exec senate reports → committee reports → class senate reports → adjournment
- Subsidiary motions
 - Motion to discuss
 - Goal is to discuss the business item or any debatable motions
 - Presenter must specify the time allotment
 - Motion must be seconded, is not debatable, will require a simple majority
 - Motion takes precedence over all other motions and must be addressed before addressing all other motions
- Mition to refer to committee
- Motion to form an ad-hoc committee
 - Motion can be brought forth if the creation of an ad-hoc committee is deemed necessary for the addressing of the business item
 - Guidelines are formed under the ad-hoc committee clause
 - Motion must be seconded, is debatable, requires ⅔ vote
- Motion to postpone
 - Postpone until later date, ⅔ majority vote
- Motion to vote
- Motion to amend
 - Friendly amendment
 - Can apply to any of the other motions
 - If the proposed amendment is acceptable to the proposer of the original motion, then will be accepted without a vote
 - o If not acceptable to proposer, requires a ⅔ majority vote to be accepted
- Motion for previous question
 - o Can be applied to any debatable motions being discussed
 - Mainly to end any discussion and immediately put senate to a vote
 - Must be seconded, is not debatable, and requires a ⅔ majority vote
- Incidental motions
 - Motion to recess

- Emergency powers
 - Emergency situations must be agreed upon as emergencies by ⅔ approval of the exec senate members
 - Emergency meeting of the senate shall be called to deal with urgent issues that require immediate attention
 - Most recent emergency meeting was for the BMA letter that went to the faculty

 - Cohort coursework ends in June
- Definitely a campuswide effort, modeled after UCSF Fresno
- WHY? Advance efforts of diversity office
- Leadership mentoring, building up your own brand
 - Leadership in medicine is uniquely important and having a head-start would be an advantage
- o WHAT?
 - Informal tutoring, application prep, PS advice, educational sessions on health disparities + health equity, etc
- Will be meeting with Dr Robinson and Dr Roy soon to come up with an established plan
- Need to flesh out the mission more, dont want to take away from people that need the
 opportunities but also want to be able to take advantage of opportunities meant to
 students
- Dr Roy has high aspirations but we might need to reign him in a little bit, he has lots of ideas but execution is often difficult. Need to figure out exactly what they want this event to be realistically, will need a lot of support, but with a solid goal it's possible
