- Were super busy so didnt rly go to optional events, olympics had a big turnout bc it seemed mandatory
- Interest group fair might not have been necessary
- Absolutely not necessary to have the schedule completely jam packed
- Information overload, a lot of extra trainings/BLS training + modules
- Better to have one week of events total, including ways to have a way for orgs + interest groups to socialize and meet without having to be like the org fair (too much and not super necessary this early)
- Senate panel might not have been as effective as it could have been? Because it was during lunch (people were distracted), or because they had information overload at that point
- Maybe have the more administrative stuff relegated to modules, and orientation reserved for things like the org fair/student senate panel/active shooter training
  - Too many cooks in the kitchen maybe
  - Have it during the school unit instead of during orientation so they can have some exposure to what we do?

- M2s had a poll about whether people got their financial aid disbursements yet
  - o 5 people responded yes, 33 responded no
- People were getting disbursement emails but no actual money
- Can be up to a week after the email to get your money?
- Dean Sakr is trying to adjust the financial aid office
  - SOM FA office used to be joined with the main campus FA office, they're now separate
  - Have to fix some kinks
  - BUT PEOPLE HAVE TO PAY RENT
- Cullen will try to follow up with them and see what's going on there

# 6:40 PM - [Discussion] Step 1 Ad Hoc update (20 min)

- March
  - Met with the deans a couple of times to talk about how our class did on step 1
  - Our class (2024) had 20 students who failed, up to 50 went on LOA

- 2023 had 9 ppl fail
- We had no info on demographics of people who went on LOA
  - Now we know
  - Laura Samuelson got the data, but we ended up getting it ourself
  - Emily from IJI helped a lot
  - Not super comfy with sharing it directly with the student body yet
  - Next step is to talk to laura about the numbers, they have been sitting on this data for a while so hoping they have some decent analysis
  - This email will occur on August 1st, from 4-5pm
  - Working on a survey to send to LOA students to check in and see how they're doing
    - Dr Waineo is sending a mental health survey, separately
  - By Dec we're going to release the data and send a follow up email to the class
- Dr Baker said he wanted to have solutions by this time next year which kind of doesn't help Co2025
- School continues to admit URIM students but doesn't have the support in place
  - This is an absolute disservice
- ISA suggested expansion of the office of equity and inclusion and other changes to help
- They might not have a minimum pass for the CBSE next year
  - Dr Braun did some research that students below a certain threshold did worse on Step, but the CBSE and CBSSA were not accurate depictions of how students did on step
- Seemed like administration was denying the stats of how many/what types of students went on LOA
- M4's have time to help tutor M2's and M1s through their years into dedicated and teaching them about Step 1
  - Try to get our M3s and M4s involved earlier on
- A lot of students are 1st generation medical students and they don't have the advice or foresight about the exam
- Best time to have the meeting with Roy, Baker, and Sakr is after we send out the survey, but before December
- Co2025 has 2 full 8 hour exams supposed to simulate content and environment of Step
  - One is in August, in person, 1 week before a school exam
    - Timing is not ideal, better time might be right after big block exam? Ex right after HDF1 final exam
  - One in January, taken online
- Students aren't taking step failures seriously enough? Maybe they don't know just how big of a red flag it is in applying to residency
  - Statistic: 72% of MDs that failed step 1 in 2017 went onto a residency, 94% who didn't fail went onto a residency
    - Probably more competitive at this point
- Step prep sessions are underutilized and underemphasized
